New Science Rooms and Generator

Proposal for Renovating Science Rooms – Public Vote on January 16, 2025

I am writing to inform you about a proposed building project to renovate our science classrooms, which were originally constructed in 1965—nearly 60 years ago. These classrooms are long overdue for an update. The renovation will provide a more modern, academically conducive environment for our students and enhance the space's safety and functionality.

In addition to the classroom renovations, we propose installing an emergency generator for the school. As a designated Red Cross emergency location, we must be able to generate emergency power in the event of a local outage. Over the last several years, we have seen the increasing importance of facilities like ours in supporting the community during emergencies. The Red Cross has identified our building as an ideal site due to our amenities, including an industrial kitchen and dining area, large spaces for emergency housing, and smaller areas suitable for emergency operations.

The estimated cost of this renovation/ emergency generator project is **\$3 million**. This project will not increase our local tax burden. We have strategically aligned the renovation with the expiration of an existing debt service, ensuring no additional financial impact on taxpayers.

Attached are photos that show the current state of the science rooms, which reflects their outdated condition. In addition to cosmetic concerns, some water and gas lines are aging and require updating.

The public vote on this proposal will take place on **January 16, 2025**, from **12:00 PM to 8:00 PM**. We encourage you to participate in this important decision and thank you in advance for your thoughtful consideration.



This scholarship is given in memory of Walter Grishkot of Glens Falls, a long-time photographer, promoter, and event planner with a lifelong passion for aviation. The Joan Grishkot Memorial Scholarship -

this \$2,500 scholarship, renewable up to four years, is for residents of Warren, Washington, or Saratoga County pursuing a major in nursing. This scholarship is given in memory of Joan Grishkot of Glens Falls, a long-time nurse, public health executive and community leader, and coorganizer of the Adirondack Balloon Festival. The Legacy Awards program begins on September 1, 2024. Legacy Awards provide \$4,000 scholarships for children and grandchildren of dues-paying Elk members. It's Concert Season!




