March Newsletter

As I write this, the temperature is a chilly 16 degrees, and we're still cleaning up after a snowstorm that lasted from Saturday night through Monday morning. Spring certainly feels like a long way off, but as we know here in the Adirondacks, things can change in an instant. Soon, the skies will clear, basketballs will be swapped for baseball bats, and tennis rackets will replace the winter gear.

With that change in season comes the reminder that we're also rounding the corner of the school year. It's getting late in the year to turn a failing grade into a passing one, but it's not impossible. Remember, after spring comes summer — and I'd wager that most students would prefer to avoid summer school.

Budget Update

We're in the final stages of this year's budget process. Initially, there were concerns that the Governor might cut our Foundation Aid, but thankfully, that did not happen. After reviewing the Rockefeller Institute report, which she had requested, it appears that she followed their recommendation to make gradual adjustments, allowing schools time to prepare for changes down the road.

Although many other expenses have increased, we were still able to stay under the Tax Cap limit. The Budget Committee will present the 2025-2026 school budget to the full Board of Education on March 17, 2025, during the regular Board meeting.

Looking ahead to next year:

- Students starting Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten have several vaccine requirements to start school; please check with their doctor or me to make sure they are up to date before starting school in the Fall.
- Students going into grade 6 are required by NYS law to have their TDaP vaccine.
- Students going into grade 7 are required by NYS law to have their Meningitis vaccine.
- Students going into grade 12 are required by NYS law to have their 2nd Meningitis vaccine.
- Students entering grades PK, Kindergarten, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11 require a physical within 12 months of the upcoming school year.

Please pack extra clothes for your child(ren) in at least grades PK-3 in case of unforeseen needs.

Please also remember to pack healthy snacks and water bottles for your kids, especially if staying after for sports/clubs.!

This scholarship is given in memory of Walter Grishkot of Glens Falls, a long-time photographer, promoter, and event planner with a lifelong passion for aviation. He was best known as co-founder and long-time organizer of the

Adirondack Balloon Festival.

SCHOLARSHIP - The Firemen's Association of the State of New York will award 25 \$1,500 scholarships to high school seniors entering college.

- Attend high school as a senior who is enrolled in the fall 2021 school year at an accredited two- or four-year institution of higher learning or an accredited technical post-secondary school.
 - Serve as a current Junior firefighter, Explorer Scout or RAM in a group affiliated with a volunteer

- department; a volunteer firefighter; or a volunteer with an EMS unit.
- Demonstrate a commitment to both volunteer emergency service and the community.

8. Crary Education Fund Scholarship

- This renewable scholarship valued up to \$1,300 is for a high school senior living in Clinton, Essex, Franklin, Hamilton, or Warren County who will be enrolling in a vocational program or college. The adjusted gross family income cannot exceed \$90,000. Exceptions to surpassing this limit will be considered but must be justified in writing by providing specific information on the number of children in the household, the number attending college, or any unusual financial circumstances.

This scholarship for \$500 is for a graduating senior from Saratoga, Warren, or Washington County. The student must be accepted into a college or trade school full-time and demonstrate financial need. Paper applications are available in the Guidance Office.

11. The 2025 Ned Carter Memorial

Scholarship – To be considered for this scholarship, which is given by the Association of Fire Districts of the State of New York, a student must be graduating in 2025, plan to attend a two or four-year institution, and be pursuing a career in a community service-related field.


Keep an eye out for open gym schedules leading up to the spring season. See the attached flyer for softball open gyms.
